Overview

Nationally Appropriate Mitigation Action (NAMA) refers to a set of policies and actions that different countries undertake as part of their commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. NAMAs emerged from the international climate negotiations under the framework of the UNFCCC. They were first mentioned in the Bali Action Plan of 2007/14 when they were referred to as "actions by developing country Parties in the context of sustainable development, supported and enabled by technology, financing and capacity building, in a measurable, reportable and verifiable manner". NAMAs have inherited central formulations from the founding United Nations Climate Change Conference in Copenhagen (COP 15); these elements (sustainable development, technology transfer, financing and capacity building) help define the obligations of developed and developing countries. Each successive agreement on NAMAs sustains these elements, and provides more details on the different aspects of NAMAs.

NAMAs is a valuable opportunity for developing countries to address greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions while remaining true to their sustainable development priorities and needs. Many countries are already taking steps to use NAMAs as instruments for participating in the global mitigation agenda and as a means of leveraging national and international support for more effective and transformational climate actions. National governments, multilateral organisations, development partners and others are joining forces to ensure that NAMAs not only contribute to urgent efforts to limit the increase of GHG emissions, but that they yield tangible results in terms of development at national and local levels, i.e., poverty reduction, job creation and energy access.

Workshop Objectives

The objective of this workshop is to provide methods for designing, implementing, and monitoring Nationally Appropriate Mitigation Actions (NAMAs), highlighting practical examples of NAMAs and progress to date in the around the world. It is also to discuss how to structure the financing of various NAMA components. The third objective is to learn how to attract stakeholders to climate change mitigation investment opportunities that can complement the implementation of the selected NAMAs. Lastly, the workshop aim to facilitate information exchange regarding best practices for financing and implementing mitigation measures.

- Strategies to educate, empower and engage all stakeholders and major groups on policies relating to climate change
- Comparing notes on existing successful projects
